To: Commercial Customers of the Malaga County Water District

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to inform you of a new ordinance enacted by the Malaga County Water District. Ordinance 2017-2, enacted 12 December 2017, creates a franchise for the collection of construction and demolition debris, and commercial trash and recycling in large containers, including drop boxes, roll off boxes, and compactors, within the boundaries of the Malaga County Water District.

Chapter 5.01 of the Malaga County Water District Ordinance code related to sanitation service allows for:

- A. The accumulation, collection, removal and disposal of solid waste, organics and recyclable materials shall be controlled by the District for the protection of the public safety and health. The Board of Directors finds that a comprehensive system for the periodic collection, removal and disposal of solid waste, the recycling of recyclable materials, and the collection, removal, disposal and/ or composting of organics, from all premises within the District is essential and benefits all occupants of premises in the District and everyone within the District.
- B. Every person owning or occupying a Residence or Commercial establishment or premises shall subscribe to solid waste collection service from the District or the District's contract agent.

Pursuant to this provision, the Malaga County Water District has adopted Ordinance 2017-2, which appoints an exclusive, franchised provider for commercial solid waste and recycling large container services: Orange Avenue Disposal Inc., dba Industrial Waste and Salvage (IWS), effective January 1, 2018.

Ordinance 2017-2 will allow the District to better regulate solid waste and recycling services, reducing the District's carbon footprint, through the restriction of large numbers of solid waste trucks traveling within District boundaries and increased diversion of materials from landfills.

IWS has provided excellent commercial frontload and residential solid waste services to the Malaga

County Water District for many years. We are confident that they will be an excellent service provider for all large container customers within the boundaries of the Malaga County Water District.

Representatives from IWS will contact you to help with the smooth transition from your current large container service provider to IWS over the next few weeks.

You should not experience any interruption of solid waste services during this transition period. Should you have any questions about the implementation of Ordinance 2017-2, please contact the District office at 559-485-7353 for assistance.
